Dr. Tzu-Ming Chang is a distinguished professor of surgery with over 50 years of experience in gastrointestinal physiology, surgical nutrition, and the brain-gut axis. He began his career as Medical Director at the National Defense Medical Center, Taiwan (1966-1972), and progressed through roles at Tri-Service General Hospital, Taipei, including resident, chief resident, and attending surgeon.

Dr. Chang furthered his expertise as a Surgical Scholar and Research Fellow at UCLA (1982-1983). He led the Division of General Surgery and the Nutrition Support Team at Tri-Service General Hospital (1988-1997) and served as Associate Professor of Surgery at the National Defense Medical Center from 1993.

His leadership roles include Vice-Superintendent at Buddhist Tzu-Chi General Hospital (1997-2000) and Tungs' Taichung MetroHarbor Hospital (2000-2013). He is currently a Professor of Surgery at the National Defense Medical Center and Cheng Hsin General Hospital.

Dr. Chang has held presidential roles in the Taiwan Society for Parenteral and Enteral Nutrition, the Taiwan Association of Endocrine Surgeons, and the Parenteral and Enteral Nutrition Society of Asia. His research interests encompass surgery, gastrointestinal physiology, peptic ulcers, gut motility, and surgical nutrition.
